

German is her first language, besides it speaks inBengali and Urdu languages and English is her literary language. She began to write in English at the age of seven and published her first story at the age of nine. She married Ashwin Desai and gave birth to four children. She wrote eighteen novels and awarded bySahityaAkademi Award for Fire on the Mountain in 1978. She was shortlisted for the Booker Prize. Her novel The Village by the Sea awarded Guardian Children's Fiction Prize.
